Retention Rate - Cohorts 2014 al 2016
Bachelor's Degree Level**

Introduction

In order to calculate the rate of retention that is reported annually in the *Institutional Postsecondary Education Data System* (IPEDS), first you select the tracking cohort. The retention rate is reported one year after establishing the tracking cohort. In the case of four-year institutions, cohort follow-up, for students of bachelor's degree level, is defined as follows:

- New students to the institution, aiming for a bachelor's degree.
- Students that have no prior college experience (First Timers).
- Defined in BANNER as students with a Regular type of Admission
- Students enrolled full-time (*Full Timers*) in their first FALL term.
- In Term 10 or Term 13

Once you select the base (number of students) of the cohort for the year of enrollment, we wait until the next academic year (first term of FALL), to determine how many of the cohort students returned to enroll at the institution. Then, we divide the number of retained students between the base of the cohort and multiply by 100 to calculate the rate of retention.

Retention rate from the 1st to the 2nd year of studies – bachelor's degree students

2014	735	578	79%
2015	700	497	71%
2016	703	559	80%
